God's Household, Part 15: "Instructions to Servants" 1 Timothy 6:1-2 Pastor Andrew Jun

Honor those we are called to serve as a way to honor God himself.

1 Timothy 6:1-2 (ESV): 1 Let all who are under a yoke as bondservants regard their own masters as worthy of all honor, so that the name of God and the teaching may not be reviled. 2 Those who have believing masters must not be disrespectful on the ground that they are brothers; rather they must serve all the better since those who benefit by their good service are believers and beloved. Teach and urge these things.

I. Instruction #1:

Christian slaves must regard their masters as worthy of all honor (1).

Principle #1: We treat people with honor ultimately because we want to uphold God's name. See Ephesians 5:5-7. See also: "Every Good Endeavor" by Tim Keller, www.faithdrivenentrepreneur.org, www.faithdriveninvestor.org.

II. Instruction #2:

Christian slaves must not be disrespectful of their Christian masters (2a).

Principle #2: We treat fellow Christians with even more respect because they are spiritual family. See 1 Timothy 3:15.

III. Instruction #3:

Christian slaves are to serve their Christian masters all the better (2a).

Principle #3: We serve others- especially fellow Christians- in order to benefit them in Christ. See Philippians 2:6-8, Luke 22:25-27, Daniel 6:26-27.

\rightarrow Life Application:

- 1. In what ways is it hard for me to honor certain people in my life (especially at work)? What attitudes and actions do I need to repent about?
- 2. In what ways do I need to change how I treat people in my life (especially at work)? How can I preach the Gospel to myself in light of serving people well?
