FAITH THAT WORKS - PART 11: "Patience in Suffering" James 5:7-12 Ps. Daniel Elianto

James 5:7-12 (ESV)

⁷ Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains.

⁸You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand.

⁹ Do not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the door.

¹⁰ As an example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

¹¹ Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

¹² But above all, my brothers, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or by any other oath, but let your "yes" be yes and your "no" be no, so that you may not fall under condemnation.

One Thing from James 5:7-12: Be patient in suffering by establishing your heart in the Lord.

Passage Overview :

How we can grow in patience during suffering by considering these three key areas:

- 1) Resist Grumbling—how we treat others in suffering (v.9)
- 2) Remain Faithful—how we stay committed to God in suffering (v.10-11)
- 3) Refrain from Rash Oaths—how we honor God with our words (v.12)
