Psalm 130:1-8 (ESV)

A Song of Ascents. ¹ Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord! ²O Lord, hear my voice! Let your ears be attentive to the voice of my pleas for mercy! ³ If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, O Lord, who could stand? ⁴ But with you there is forgiveness, that you may be feared. ⁵ I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope; ⁶ my soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen for the morning. more than watchmen for the morning. ⁷O Israel, hope in the Lord! For with the Lord there is steadfast love. and with him is plentiful redemption.

⁸ And he will redeem Israel from all his iniquities.

One Thing

We must remember that in our seasons of waiting, God is doing the important work of maturing us.
